The bread not only provided life sustenance, but the leftovers were given to the extremely impoverished community that surrounds the Good Hope Home. Mama Mary always shares with others who often have nothing else to eat. The word immediately went all for prayer support from our Mabopane Foundation partners.

In December God began to answer those prayers when an organization in the nearby town of Pretoria, South Africa heard of the need and offered to help start a bakery in a small vacant building at the Good Hope Home. With much work and perseverance, the bakery construction began in the first quarter of 2009. In June 2009 the bakery was in full operation and a mission team from the states got to witness it in action firsthand.

What an amazing God!

We prayed that God would meet this need by providing another bread vendor. Being a God who can do far above what we ask or think, He not only provided a way for "our kids" to bake their own bread but they can still give to the community around them. Our children can learn a trade and have jobs right where they live .
